

There are a lot of projects scheduled, but we just need someone to help with them.







Death of John C. Burgess.

John C. Burgess, a '51 ploneer of Sisklyou county, who died last week, was one of the oldest and best known was one of the oldest and best known residents in our midst, and has figured conspicuously as an important personage during his young days, having come here when about 21 years of age, from Virginia, his native State. He and his brother Wm. Burgess, had a pack train during the starvation times on Salmon river, in March 1851, when a heavy snow storm occurred, and were joined while in Scott Valley by men from that section. Parties were men from that section. Parties were traveling occasionally through the county from Oregon to the Sacramento Valley, via Shasta Valley and Sacramento river, Yreka creek being a favorite camping ground. The first discovery of gold in this county was made about that time on Verka creek the late. Dr that time on Yreka creek, the late Dr. F. G. Hearn of Yreka, and Silas J. Day of Jacksonville, Or., being the only two men in Yreka when gold was discovered, Burgess having located in Hawkinsville, where he owned the present Simmons ranch. Burgess also owned a fine ranch at Willow Oreek some years later, which was sold. In 1851-2 he was active in efforts to protect the incoming immigrants from the plains and from Oregon and Central California, as the Indians were then very troublesome, having volunteered his services on various occasions. In 1869 he was elected sheriff, serving two years, and since that time had been engaged in mining and road building. He superintended the works ing of the old Eliza mine on Humbug, for a San Francisco company, which yielded handsome returns for a long period. Many years ago he plowed up all the streets of Yreka, making good gutters, rounding up in the center, besides covering with gravel, doing a fine job, and has made many good pleess of wagen roads for the county. pleces of wagon roads for the county. John Burgess was a hard worker and a worthy citizen, whose good deeds will be long remembered. Sincere sympathy is tendered to his bereaved family in their sad loss.

Death of Ex-Sheriff Burgess.

John Chesterfield Burgess, sheriff of this county in 1860-70, also a Mexican war veteran, and native of Virginia, died last night, after an illness of several wocks, aged 75 years. He came to this county early in 1851 with the first settlers, and was a leader in fighting the hostile Indians during the early 50's. Deceased has lived at Little Shasta, Willow Creek, and Hawkinsville, during early days, but made Yreka his home ever since serving as sheriff. He was an energetic, upright, and public spirited citizen and leaves a wife and a number of grown children to mourn his loss. Time of funeral not yet fixed as we go to press.

Woman's Death from Hanging
Unknown Woman Siskiyou News Sept 18, 1902, page 1.

Woman's Death From Hanging.

Last Saturday morning as P. H. Donoghue and W. S. Arnold, of Henley, were looking over some property, a couple of miles west of Hornbrook, they found a lady's hat, cape, night gown, small handbag, two purses, containing \$1.15, and a fruit knife, in a gulch about three hundred yards north of Clay Foster's house, in which no one had been living for the past month. They reported their find and the next morning Elmer E. Cagle, who lives about a mile distant, went up to the gulch and continued on fifty yards further and found the remains of a woman hanging to a small oak tree. Coroner John A. Fairchild was notified and at once went to the scene. He reports that she was a rather large woman, about 50 years old, wore a brown dress with a white crocheted collar of cheap material, a pair of cheap shoes, with a patch on the outside of the sole of each. The body was badly decomposed, baving hung in the hot sun for at least a week and perhaps two. There was nothing among the things found or on her person, by which she could be identified, except a small piece of paper written in a vertical child's hand writing "Hornbrook, California."

About ten days ago Robert J. Ward noticed a woman dressed in dark clothes in that vicinity. The jury returned a verdict that she probably came to her death by foul play. W. G. Day is working on a clue.

Death of David M. Bean Bean, David M Yreka Journal Sept 2, 1908

Death of David M. Bean.

After suffering with a stroke of paralysis which came to him early in the month of August, David McQueen Bean at an early hour Tuesday morning, September 1st, crossed the "Great Divide."

He was born at Huntsville, in northern Tennessee, October 25, 1820, and was at the time of his death within a few weeks of 88 years of age. In 1854 he came via the Isthmus of Panama to the Pacific Coast, and after a couple of weeks spent in San Francisco, came to Siskiyou county, settling in Yreka, which place and in the vicinity of it has been his home for more than half a century

For a few years he engaged in mining afterwards worked at his trade as blacksmith at Greenhorn creek. Twodaughters survive him, Mrs. O. H. Woods of Sacramento and Mrs. H. E. Strassler at whose home he has lived for the past fourteen years. Both daughters were with him to the last,

for the past fourteen years. Both daughters were with him to the last.

In a few short years the papers will cease printing oblinary notices of the old ploneers. The ranks are fast being decimated and they soon will be but a memory.
